

ward-winning interior designer
Shirley Wagner believes in
creating nurturing interiors for
homeowners in Hawai'i. Her
portfolio ranges from cozy beach
cottages in Puako to palatial estate homes on
the Kohala Coast. Now she's expanded upon her
soul-soothing philosophy of interior design by
introducing a new line of sustainable and healthy
furnishings she calls, Design Alive.

Principal of Fine Design Interiors Inc., of Waimea, Shirley first discovered the topic of healthy furnishings when talking with her professional upholsterer of many years. Come to find out that nearly all foam cushions are petroleum-based. Then when local woodworker Ryan Donnelly told her he'd stopped working with toxic glues and finishes and switched to non-toxic materials, she realized it was important to always question where your furniture is manufactured and what it is made of.

"Tve been researching this intensely for five years," she said. "Tve wanted to do a collection like this for a long time that brings style into the healthy choice. It's definitely a niche offering for clients who want custom furnishings to be healthy and not full of off-gassing chemicals."

A member of the global Sustainable Furnishings Council, Shirley can offer package collections or individual pieces. Although 100-percent organic mattresses can be pricey for example, Shirley says sustainably-made furnishings and textiles aren't any more expensive than other high-end interiors, relatively speaking.

"Nobody in Hawaii really offers these types of

products as a collection," she said. "It's a custom service that involves special ordering."

For those who want to go all in, hand-tufted silk carpets can be made with no adhesives, for example. There are also companies that craft ecofriendly, sustainable outdoor furniture made of green materials. You can also opt for sustainable, locally sourced hardwood furniture made with nontoxic finishes.

In lieu of new furnishings, there's the option of reupholstering existing furniture with organic latex derived from the rubber wood tree. If you're not ready or able to hire a designer, Shirley says you can start by ordering an organic mattress locally through SlumberWorld in Kona, or find organic sheets at Target.

"No matter what small steps you take, I feel it's important to make your surroundings as healthy as possible, for ourselves and for the planet."
